

The centrepiece of our Assembly Hall is Flight, a sculptural art installation by esteemed Canadian artists Temma Gentles and William Roddy.



Set against a backlit window, the artwork's layers of near transparency create a contemplative and healing aesthetic through silhouettes of birds in flight.



The thematic keynote of the installation is a phrase from the memorial prayer El Malei Rachamim, wishing for the souls of the dead to find peace in God's nurturing presence.





William and Judi Designs Assembly Hall


Gathering in remembrance
